Cultivating contemporary monologues for process and audition material are the subject of the explorations for the semester.

Cultivating improvisational tools through the study of Anne Bogart's Viewpoints, and exploration of open scenes and contemporary scripted scenes are the subjects of the explorations for the semester.

This class intends to help students find physical and emotional life in their work connected to the active pursuit of objectives in musical theatres solo and duet texts. In other words, this course intends to help students to "act" their songs.
THE 209	ACTING IV: STYLES IN ACTING This course is a continuation in the study of the art and craft of acting as is relates to different styles and genres of the Theatre. It helps the student understand exactly what is meant by the term "style" and how to cultivate tools that will allow them to understand and execute work in different styles that move beyond realism. The class work focuses on the work of William Shakespeare.
THE 208	ACTING III: ADVANCED SCENE STUDY This class is focused on the plays of Anton Chekhov. It employs the techniques the Michael Chekhov to construct character and continue the "psycho-physical" connection to acting.
THE 120	THEATRE APPRECIATION (full semester and 3-week January/summer term) This course examines the collaborative process of Theatre arts from the printed page to the live performance. The course investigates the contributions of the playwright, actor, director, designers and the audience.
THE 111	THEATRE LAB (also created class) This class serves as a forum for students to cultivate practical professional skills. Through seminars, guest speakers and master classes, this lab will give the students necessary tools to enter the professional theatre.

#### THE 110 ACTING II: SCENE STUDY

This class continues the cultivation of "psycho-physical" acting through the study of contemporary Theatre scenes.

#### THE 107 ACTING I: INTRODUCTION TO ACTING

This course is an introduction to the world of theatre performance. It emphasizes developing the fundamental skills in developing a "psycho-physical" process for the actor. It also helps the student develop an overall appreciation for the role of the theatre in today's society. In addition, the class hopes to make the student a more astute observer of human interaction and behaviors. Finally, this course emphasizes the *process* of acting and will serve as a foundation for the students pursuing theatre as a career

#### THE 4930 PROFESSIONAL MUSIC THEATRE TECHNIQUE I (also created course) This yearlong sequence was designed to aid the student in the selection of appropriate audition material. It instructed the student in proper audition etiquette. The course helped the student design strategies for pursuing professional aspirations in the professional theatre. This class also intended to help students find physical and emotional life in their work, in other words, to "act" their songs. This was the first time a class of this nature was offered in the undergraduate program at Florida Atlantic University. Students were required to attend professional auditions and private voice lessons as a lab component to the class.

THE 4930PROFESSIONAL MUSIC THEATRE TECHNIQUE II (also created course)This was the first time this class was offered by the university. It is a continuation of Professional Music TheatreTechnique I. This class begins expansion into performance for an audience. It culminated in an original evening ofmusical theatre entitled *Heart & Music:* A Showcase of Contemporary Music Theatre. The participants in class will thenmake up the core company for The FAU Summer Festival Repertory (along with Equity guest artists).

#### THE 4930 PROFESSIONAL MUSIC THEATRE TECHNIQUE III (also created course) This was the first time this class was offered by the university. It is a continuation of Professional Music Theatre Technique II. This class expansion continues with selection of proper audition material and completion of the audition "book" for aspiring musical theatre performers. This class serves as a laboratory for giving real-world scenarios for the student artist.

#### THE 4930 PROFESSIONAL MUSIC THEATRE TECHNIQUE IV (also created course) This class is a continuation of Professional Music Theatre Technique III. This will culminate in final showcase performance.

# TPP 2110 ACTING I

This course begins to define the highly disciplined process for the future professional theatre practitioner. There were explorations in three basic areas of human involvement; relationship to objects, environment and people. This is a Stanislavski-based class that incorporates the work of manyacting teachers (Meisner, Hagen, Chekhov, Shurtleff, etc.).

#### THE 2000 THEATRE APPRECIATION

This was a lecture class that had 160+ students. This class is primarily for non-majors. The class uses film clips, taped performances, internet resources and attendance of live performances. The class hopes to foster a curiosity in the art of the theatre for non-practitioners.

#### PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT SEMINAR FOR BFA/MFA STUDENTS

This is a professionally based seminar on developing strategies of entering the professional world. It will assist students in learning about the professional and monetary demands of becoming a professional actor. It will encompass various aspects of the profession, including information about professional audition techniques. It will also instruct students about union membership, promotional materials and using new media to fully market their product (web sites, demos, etc.). The seminar also introduces graduate school options for the student desiring further training.
